A Happy New Year to you and a warm hello from Kranji Primary!

#### Nurturing Future-Ready Learners



Kranji Primary School is committed to provide a forward-looking learning experience in the school so that all our students can be future-ready at the end of their six years with us. The **EXCITE Learning Approach** (**EX**periential, **C**haracter Focused, **I**nquiry Based, **T**echnology Mediated, Positive **E**ducation Driven) outlines what our Kranjians experience here in Kranji Primary on a daily

basis, and is a consolidation of how learning is designed, curated and enacted in Kranji Primary School (KPS). Central to EXCITE are our key programmes, including the 1:1 Learning Experience that provides all our P4 & P5 students with an iPad for learning, our Applied Learning Programme (ALP) that focuses on Nurturing Joyful Learners through Critical and Inventive Thinking, as well as our Learning for Life Programme (LLP) that focuses on Developing Champions in Life through Sports. To build our teachers' competencies in the classroom, we took on Differentiated Instruction as a school-wide professional development endeavor, with the purpose to meet the diverse learning needs of all students in order to maximize their progress in learning. Last year too, dedicated groups of teachers also took on e-Pedagogy by creating new learning possibilities afforded by digital technologies. We continue our partnership with the National Healthcare Group for a second year, to inculcate positive health habits and increase motivation in our students, through the infusion of *Growth Mindset* key messages into our P1 to P4 lessons.

In 2021, we continue our string of achievements in the student and staff domains. After the streak of national-level awards in 2020, my colleagues were again recognized with the National Day Awards Commendation Medal and Long Service Award, Fellow of Academy of Singapore Teachers Award, and 14 MOE Service Excellence Awards. In addition, they presented in at least 4 seminars and conferences in the areas of Math, Project Work, Malay Language and Chinese Language. This is testament to the quality educators that we have in our midst at Kranji Primary School.

25th Anniversary Celebration – Champions Celebrate The school will be celebrating our 25<sup>th</sup> birthday with a big bang this year. As part of the celebration, the school will be launching a Heritage Wall, an e-book publication to capture our 25 years of history, yearlong programmes to commemorate the occasion including dedicated School Assemblies and school events tying in the celebration theme. Finally, to cap the year-long celebration, we will be organising a Learning Carnival titled "EXCITE Fiesta! – Champions Celebrate". #### Partnering Parents

I would like to strongly encourage parents/guardians to follow us on Facebook and/or Instagram, where we update school happenings on a very regular basis. Keep in touch with us and keep abreast of what is happening in Kranji Primary. We have good parent support in the school, many of whom contribute regularly through our Parent Support Group. I strongly encourage you to play an active part in your child's educational journey with us, by being a part of the strong parent support in the school. In addition, all official correspondence from the school has been through Parents Gateway since 2020, and I will be updating you on a monthly basis on school happenings. Look out for Form Teachers' Start-of-Year letter, for communication channels with your child's teachers.

We will be holding a series of Parent Meetings with Form Teachers and Principal starting next week and letters have been shared through Parents Gateway yesterday. With the exception of P1 parents, whom I would have met on the first day of school, I will be looking forward to meeting P2 to P6 parents during the online sessions planned by the school. I will be sharing pertinent information related to your child's level at the Briefing, and the Form Teachers will be sharing useful tips on how to help your child, and their observations about the class.

As the Covid-19 situation in the country becomes endemic, I would like to strongly urge all parents to allow your child to be vaccinated. This is in the hope that the tightened school measures can be loosened in due time, when more of our children are vaccinated. Till then, the school measures like mask wearing, wiping down, keeping a safe distance, frequent washing of hands etc continue to be in place and strictly observed.

## JumpStart@Kranji 2022




In the 1st week of school, our students were supported with the various activities under our JumpStart@Kranji programme to help them transit into the new school year.

Through the activities, our students learnt more about the school's vision, mission and core values. They also learnt about the expected behaviour in school, familiarised themselves with the class routines and made new friends. Class bonding activities were conducted by the Form Teachers to build and strengthen teacherstudent relationships as well as nurture friendships among the students. ## CHINESE NEW YEAR CELEBRATION

## Commencement of CCA

## Student Safety—Cycling to School

Given the hazards that cyclists may encounter, the school is concerned about the safety of students who cycle to school. It is thus important for you to remind your child/ward to take the necessary safety precautions, including but not limited to the following:

- a. Make sure that the bicycle is in good working condition. Bicycles should ideally be fitted with front and rear lights and a bell. You or your child should ensure that the bicycle's brakes, chains, tyres, lights and bell are well-maintained and are in good working order.
- b. Your child/ward should always wear protective gear, such as a helmet, and proper shoes (if there are shoelaces, they should be properly tied) to protect against injury.
- c. Your child/ward should be reminded not to use his or her mobile phone, even with an in-ear attachment, or listen to music through earphones while cycling.
- d. Cycle along bicycle track instead of on the road.
- e. Give hand signal early and clearly.
- f. Obey all traffic rules at all times.

Your child/ward is advised to secure his or her bicycle at the bicycle racks located on the school premises. The school will not be responsible for the loss of, or any damage to, your child's bicycle.

For safety reasons, students (especially lower primary students) are not encouraged to ride their bikes to and from school as they may not know the traffic rules well and possess sufficient skills to ride on roads where the risk of fatal accidents is higher.

## **COVID-19 VACCINATION**



If your child has recently taken a COVID-19 vaccination, please ask your child to inform his/her PE teachers and CCA teachers so that your child can be exempted from strenuous physical activities for two weeks. Parents are required to submit the vaccination appointment dates to the school via this link https://go.gov.sg/kpsvaccine.
